

(LAHHA) was founded in 1971 for "the promotion, sponsorship, and cultivation of use, ownership, and care of horses for horsemen in the Town of Los Altos Hills and neighboring communities: to support all activities concerning horsemanship; to encourage the acquisition, building, maintenance, and supervision of the pathways system and their rights of way; to encourage non-vehicular use of trails in the community of Los Altos Hills; to represent the interests of **Los Altos Hills Horsemen's Association** members in educating and influencing the leaders of the Town of Los Altos Hills and neighboring communities to ensure the continued ability of citizens to keep and enjoy horses, including support and advocacy of or opposition to legislation."

LOS ALTOS HILLS AND HORSES

Once mainly orchards and horse ranches, the Town of Los Altos Hills had more horses than people when it was incorporated in 1959. Despite growing populations and the urbanization of neighboring cities, there are still exceptional opportunities for horses and their riders in Los Altos Hills today. This is thanks to the foresight of the town's founders and early residents, who adopted measures to encourage and protect the semi-rural and horse-friendly character of the town. They implemented one-acre minimum lot sizes (which enabled backyard pastures for horses), and a Pathways System with multi-use paths that criss-cross the town and connect neighborhoods. We feel very fortunate to follow in their footsteps today.



LAHHA MEMBERS

Our members include people of all ages, from all backgrounds. They live in Los Altos Hills and the surrounding areas. Some own horses, some do not. Some ride, while others just enjoy being in their presence. What brings our members together is a common interest in having horses in our community.



TOWN AMENITIES FOR EQUESTRIANS

Very few towns provide such convenient access to the wealth of horse-related resources that we enjoy in Los Altos Hills.

Our Pathways System's extensive network of trails allows us to ride throughout town, and provides access to local stables, open space preserves, and the Los Altos Hills Town Arena.

The Los Altos Hills Town Arena on Purissima Rd. was established by LAHHA and the Town, and is open to the public for equestrian use.

There are four stables within the town (Westwind Community Barn, Fremont Hills, Maple Leaf Farm, and Rancho de las Reinas). Local equestrians also keep their horses in backyard pastures.

Our pathways provide connections to beautiful open space preserves such as Rancho San Antonio, Arastradero, Esther Clark, Byrne Preserve, and Hidden Villa, and to many other trails leading to outstanding scenery and vistas in the more remote areas.
